The **Peter Wolfe Chapter (PWC)** is a part of the North Country Trail Association (NCTA).

Chapter volunteers build and maintain 121 miles of non-motorized hiking path along the North Country National Scenic Trail (NCNST) from M-64 South of Ontonagon, to 21 miles east of Canyon Falls, near Craig Lake SP in Baraga County. The NCNST, a unit of the National Park Service, is the longest of the 11 National Scenic Trails, with over 4,800 miles from North Dakota into Vermont.

Peter Wolfe is considered to be the first person to have walked the entire length of the NCT several years before the Trail was officially established as a *National Scenic Trail* by Congress in 1980. Peter then settled in what he considered to be the most friendly and beautiful section of that long trail, in nearby Mass City.

Join the PWC, lace up your hiking boots and make new friends or renew your acquaintances! Participate in our monthly, year-round organized hikes or become engaged in various volunteer activities along the many miles of forested trails and enjoy firsthand the experience of:


