The Superior Shoreline Chapter of the North Country Trail Association has responsibility for one of the most beautiful sections of trail in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, commencing at the mouth of the Two-Hearted River along the shore of Lake Superior west to Grand Marais and then through Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore onto Munising and ending further west at the Rock River Road.

This western segment is located within the Hiawatha National Forest. The trail leaves the shoreline of the lake and heads inland. This section is hardwood forest with gradual ascents and descents from ridges to valleys and back to ridges with a few switchbacks added, following the contours of the forest providing a distinctive outdoor experience. As it meanders through the forest it crosses old logging roads, long abandoned settlements taken over by nature, a former prisoner of war camp, streams and ponds.

Because it is a trail seldom hiked, it is rare that one will meet another hiker, the solitude adding to the enjoyment of the experience. Enjoy your hike and leave nothing but footprints.
